



WORSHIP TRAINING TOPICAL SUMMARY

Training is available in a number of different topics, ranging from the more theological aspects of worship ministry right through to some fundamentally practical tools such as vocal technique or song writing skills.

Following is a summary of topics that have proved to be successful in previous worship training programmes. All of the following are **GUIDELINES ONLY**. Each is able to be amended and adjusted to be specific to your particular context and church environment.

The Liberated Worshipper - investigates the characteristics of a liberated worshipper as opposed to someone who finds themselves still bound in so many ways and offers keys to find release in your life.

Lessons From A Worshipper - Taken from Psalm 138, we look at principles that we can learn from the life of David and apply to our own personal lives in our relationship with the Lord and as worshippers.

The Importance of the Unseen - In everything we do; the public and the private, everything simply must rest on the foundation of relationship with God. This topic analyses how that aspect of our lives is going and gives some inspirational insights and advice as to why it is important to keep our relationship with God fresh and growing.

The 5 Languages of Worship - In much the same way as Dr Gary Chapman investigates the 5 love languages; we have taken this principle and investigated how these 'languages' find their natural expression of worship. This knowledge creates opportunity for a new understanding of our own expression of worship as well as an appreciation for those around us.

The Power of A New Song - Every country has an anthem. Every life is singing a song. What is the song being sung over your life: despair, hopelessness, loneliness, or is it salvation, hope, healing and strength? In this topic, we look at the power in changing the song that is sung over your life and the affect that it has not just in your own life, but in the lives of all who hear it.

The Philosophy of Worship - This topic attempts to answer fundamental questions such as: What is worship? Why do we worship? What is a worshipper? What does it mean to worship in spirit and in truth? We also look at some biblical examples of worshippers and the principles we can glean from their experiences.

Worship that Changes The World - Do we really comprehend the reality that as one person is changed and begins to worship the King of kings and the Lord of lords, that the world is being changed saved soul by saved soul? In this topic, we investigate this concept and look at how you can impact your world and be a place of salvation, of peace, of refuge, of healing to the world around us, and all this in the context of worship ministry.

Building A Strong Team - In this topic, we will discuss biblical tools that will assist you in building, developing and strengthening your worship team.

The Multi-Generational Church - Nowhere other than in the church we will find such a diverse melting pot of 'preferences' when it comes to expressions of worship! For as long as the church has been in existence there has been criticism about the 'style' of worship that individual churches embrace. This topic looks at concept of a multi-generational church – what does it look like? How does it work and then investigate further through analysing different expressions of worship and the way that people are naturally drawn to various expressions. The overall goal of this topic is for individuals involved in worship teams to develop a deeper sense of awareness and appreciation for the broader body of Christ.

Excellence vs Professionalism - Professionalism is something that has been 'outlawed' in the church. Instead we have adopted a concept called 'excellence'. Yet for some, there has been no real differentiation between the two. This workshop explains the difference between professionalism and excellence and what it means for you as an individual as well as a team.

What Makes A Great Team - What is that takes a team of people from being an average worship team to being a great worship team? This session looks at areas such as skill vs attitude, individual roles & responsibilities as well as communication and the relationship between the worship team and church leadership.

Song Writing - What is a song? What is song structure? This workshop looks at defining some of the practicalities of song structure as well as imparting some very practical and thought provoking concepts to apply when going through the process of song writing in the context of writing for the church.

Vocal Technique - How does my voice work? How can I get the most out of it? How do I warm up my voice? All these questions and more are answered in this practically based vocal workshop designed to improve your vocal knowledge and know how to apply it.

Guitar/Rhythm Workshops - Our trainers will work with specific instruments, share valuable insight that will assist musicians in getting the most out of their instruments as well as themselves in the context of a worship team

Sound Workshop - We will spend time working with sound people who want to know more about their craft and how to the best job possible. (Even if their resources are limited!)

Practical tips for Worship Leaders - We look at some very practical tips for those leading worship within their local churches which can be taken and applied immediately.
